## Why THESE Books of the Bible?

Various Scriptures February 4, 2018

Sola Scriptura is the conviction that only the Bible—because it is God's inspired, inerrant Word—is our SUFFICIENT and FINAL authority. But are we confident that the Bible is inspired by God and without error? Today we continue to explore the reliability of Scripture by asking the question, "Why THESE books of the Bible?"

- "CANON" is another word for the collection of inspired books of the Bible.
- No individual or church council CREATED or DECIDED the list of inspired books. Rather, books inspired by God were DISCOVERED and RECOGNIZED over time by God's people as they were written and collected.
- 3. There was informal CRITERIA used by the people of God along the way to recognize inspired and canonical books.
  - Is the book AUTHORITATIVE? Was it written by a recognized prophet, apostle or man of God?
  - Is the book INSPIRED? Does it claim to be God's Word?
  - Is the book ORTHODOX? Does it agree with previously recognized Scripture?
  - Is the book ACCEPTED? Was it received as God's Word by God's people for whom it was originally intended?

- 5. Do you feel like you are more ready to have a conversation with someone about the canon-related questions? If not, what are you going to do about that?
