II. The CHALLENGE to Biblical Authority

A "slip & slide" through history . . .

4th-15th Century Middle Ages: TRADITIONALISM
 The CHURCH is our final authority.

16th C. Reformation: SOLA SCRIPTURA
 The BIBLE is our final authority.

 17th -20th C. Enlightenment/Modernism: RATIONALISM HUMAN REASON is our final authority.

21st C. Post-Modernism: RELATIVISM, SUBJECTIVISM, PLURALISM
 There is NO final authority.

III. RE-EMBRACING Biblical Authority

What's it look like . . .

- An ongoing decision, based on the Gospel and lordship of Jesus, to HUMBLE yourself and live your life UNDER the authority of the Bible.
- A commitment to SEEK, TRUST and OBEY all that the Bible teaches, even when you don't UNDERSTAND it and/or don't LIKE it.
- A boldness to reject cultural IDEAS and TRENDS when they don't line-up with the Bible's clear teaching.

- Go back to all we've covered so far. Explore your DOUBTS. Pursue answers to your QUESTIONS.
- READ and STUDY the Bible, asking God to GUIDE you.

Authority is a bad word in today's world. We've all been taught to "Question Authority." And yet the Bible makes an authoritative claim upon our lives. In the Bible, God commands us to live in certain ways, to do and not do certain things. So the question for each of us is "Are We Willing to Live Under the Authority of the Bible?"

Our Sola Scriptura Study So Far . . .

I. The CLAIM of Biblical Authority

- Just as the character of God determines the nature of Scripture, so the nature of Scripture determines its authority.
- If the Bible is God's INSPIRED, INERRANT Word, then it is authoritative, because God is the ultimate authority.
- The FORMS of Scripture are authoritative.
 (commands, laws, and precepts)
- Jesus' APPEALS to Scripture as authoritative.
- Jesus says that OBEDIENCE to His authoritative commands is evidence of our LOVE for Him. (John 14:15)
