Connecting & Caring Together (about 20 min.)

In this 7th week of Spring Growth Groups, share a favorite story of God at work in the world this week.

Grappling with God's Word Together (about 20 - 30 min.)

1. How did you come under God's Word in the message this week? What did you feel and think in response to God's Word?

2. Read Acts 12:1-25 together as a group, looking for ways in which the whole passage hangs together as a single story. Review the context, characters, crisis, climax and resolution of this story.

3. Discuss the difficulty and the good design of God to call us to consistently live our lives in a "Cliff-Hanger" (12:5).

4. Discuss how the unexpectedness of Peter's rescue supports the undeniableness of Peter's rescue. Why do we need to tell these kinds of stories to one another? Do you have a story to tell? Take time to share.

5. Compare and contrast Herod the king and Jesus the King.

6. How does the death of Herod the king both warn and encourage us as followers of Christ the King?
