III. Gospel OPPOSITION

- First, they verbally abused him (18:6).
- Second, they brought public charges against him (18:13).

IV. Gospel ENCOURAGEMENT

- A GOOD REPORT and a FINANCIAL GIFT from Thessalonica (18:5).
- People BELIEVING and being BAPTIZED (18:8).
- The assurance of GOD'S WORD (18:9-10).
- PROVIDENTIAL PROTECTION under the civil government (18:12-18).



I Have Many in This City!

Acts 18:1-22 Sunday, September 10, 2017

Acts 18:1-22 tells the story of Paul's two year stay in the hustling and bustling city of Corinth, the last major stop on Paul's 2nd Missionary Journey. Here we notice 4 Constants in Paul's outreach with the Gospel...

I. Gospel STRATEGY

5 ways Paul was strategic in his outreach:

- 1. LOCATION: A long stay in Corinth (18:1, 11)
- 2. PROFESSION: Tent-making (18:3)
- 3. INTELLECT: Reasoning and persuading (18:4)
- 4. CONNECTIONS: Starting at the synagogue (18:4)
- 5. RELATIONSHIPS: The house of Titius Justus (18:7)

II. Gospel PARTNERS

- Aquila and Priscilla gave Paul a place to LIVE/WORK and an immediate SOCIAL NETWORK (18:3).
- Silas, Timothy and the church at Thessalonica enabled Paul to give
 MORE of his TIME and ENERGY to Gospel outreach (18:5).
- Tituis Justus gave him a HOME BASE for Gospel outreach (18:7).

3. Paul didn't just "dump and run" with the Gospel. In fact, he used a ton of strategy as he reached out with the Gospel. What were some of his strategic moves?

4. Most of us aren't thinking much at all about Gospel outreach, much less strategically. Why is that and how do we change that? Why is reaching out with the Gospel so challenging to keep on our radar?

5. Paul used his location, his profession, his education, his connections and his relationships to strategically share the Gospel. How might you use those same gifts for your own Gospel outreach?

6. There are lots of names in Acts 18:1-22. Which of these names were Paul's Gospel partners? Does everyone need to be a "mouth" like Paul for Jesus?

Take time to pray by name for not-yet-Christians you know. Pray that the Lord will grow your burden and passion for the lost and lead you to strategic ways to reach out.
