- 5. What is the basis of Abraham's bold faith-filled bartering with God in 18: 24-25? What is he challenging? How is Abraham here fulfilling his calling defined in Genesis 18:19?
- 6. In their bartering together, what exactly does God promise to Abraham?

 Does He just promise to not "sweep away the righteous with the wicked" or does He promise something more? What do we make of this?
- 7. What does Abraham know about who God is? How does this text point us to Jesus and the Gospel?

- 1. How might, or how can the fact that God has been working out a sovereign plan of salvation since Abraham (and before) affect the way we live our lives in the world?
- 2. What does it mean and look like to live by faith in the world today?
